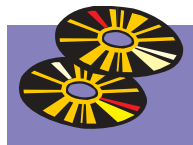

In summary, I think Bob's partner should have advanced to four spades, and that Bob's hand had improved such that he could afford to bid more than four hearts, but the advances are not at all clear, and his choice was reasonable.

John Cunningham

Agreed. As in many of these situations, both players might have bid differently, and it is easy for one player to blame the other. I'd bet that in a true poll (not one conducted by the protagonists), the blame would be pretty evenly distributed. In my view, it's a little ridiculous on this hand for one partner to totally place the blame at his partner's feet.

Since the CBF has announced that it is not feasible to leave the ACBL and have our own league the ACBL has decided to repay our loyalty in a strange way.

At the Philadelphia board of governors meeting it was announced from now on the CBF plus other organizations would now have to pay a percentage to the ACBL for collecting our dues, plus pay for other services.

For the CBF, the figure was set at 4% PLUS an hourly fee for other services the CBF requests of the ACBL. It was announced that they at present collect about one hundred thousand dollars so the ACBL would keep \$4000.00. There was no mention of what the hourly fee would be or for what "other" services would entail.

The scary part was not only does this look like a further cash grab by the ACBL, but as the ACBL's history shows, they raise all their rates yearly so within a few years I am sure this will be up to 10 %.

Hopefully, we never talk of leaving the ACBL again, or they may decide to keep all our money!

with them in the 1950's. The CBF consists of volunteers, all of whom have full-time occupations. It would be very difficult for them to organize a secession.

What's needed to make it happen is a champion of the cause. Many would like to see someone like you, Randy, take up the cudgel and "just do it!" - Ed.

To the Editor,

Fee, Fie, etc. You asked for comments regarding Bob McFee's missed six hearts. Holding AJ9xxx, KQxx, x, AK opposite Qx, Axxx, Axxx, xxx, Bob had backed away with four hearts after the auction one spade, one no trump (forcing), three hearts, four diamonds. Partner passed. Angst.

Two questions. One: is the hand demonstrably worth more than four hearts? Well, this is tempered by your estimate of partner's imagination. It is absolutely clear that four diamonds is accepting hearts and showing the diamond ace. No question. An experienced player need have little else: a less accomplished one may be expected to have a few little extras...slam would be likely, indeed.

Bob pushed to bid three hearts, it is true. But the four diamond bid causes a re-evaluation: all you need think about is partner's major holdings. He could conceivably hold two small spades and four small hearts, with diamond wastage, sure. So four hearts has merit. If you are going to bid something else, what? I think five clubs may be pointless. What is partner to do over that? On this hand it would possibly propel you to seven hearts. I would try four spades here, but if uncharitably disposed to partner (could he pass this?), try five hearts, hopefully focussing on clubs. (Do we have three losers here, partner.)

This hand is basically a matter of partnership confidence. Bob's hand is no longer the minimum he thought it was, yet the various advances are murky. Partner is clearly expecting that Bob overbid. *(Not a good partnership philosophy. - Ed.)*
